Mr. Keith Bristow is Vice Chairman of Arcanum. In this senior leadership role, Mr. Bristow provides leadership at a strategic level and acts as a key decision-maker within the organization, contributing to the development and implementation of the vision for the future of Arcanum.

Mr. Bristow joined Arcanum immediately after his tenure with the U.K. government as the first Director General of the National Crime Agency (NCA), the body charged with leading the U.K.'s fight to cut serious and organized crime.

In addition to his role with Arcanum, Mr. Bristow holds a number of advisory and non-executive positions with large corporations and international law enforcement agencies.

From 2006 to 2015, Mr. Bristow chaired the G8 Law Enforcement Group, improving international coordination and cooperation. In 2014 and 2015, he chaired the Five Eyes Law Enforcement Group, a partnership between the U.K., U.S., Australia, Canada and New Zealand, which seeks to reduce the international threat and impact of organized crime.

As an influential voice on contemporary law enforcement issues, Mr. Bristow has a substantial record of keynote addresses both domestically and internationally. Of special note, in 2012, he delivered the James Smart lecture "Joined up public protection" and in 2014 the Police Foundation lecture "Policing with consent in the digital age".

Mr. Bristow graduated from the European Top Senior Police Officer Programme and holds a Masters Degree in Organizational Development, a postgraduate diploma in Management Studies and a diploma in Applied Criminology from the University of Cambridge.

Mr. Bristow has been commended on several occasions for bravery, leadership and investigative skill, and has received a number of professional awards including most recently the FBI Director's Medallion. In June 2008, Her Majesty the Queen honored Mr. Bristow with the Queen's Police Medal for distinguished police service in her Birthday Honours

List.
